Accompanying Jack Kane was Walter Darr, a recent addition at the National Mediation Board (NMB). Also present were newly-elected committee members John Compton (Local 567) and Don Dougherty (Local 513). The committee would like to thank Frank Pecoraro (Local 513) for his contributions to the committee over the last three years.

The meeting with the mediator consisted of a power point presentation and discussion outlining specific reasons why the membership rejected the previous tentative agreement by a two-thirds vote. Additionally, Jack Kane was briefed on the progress made by the TWU Negotiating committee since August 24, 2010. Based on the subsequent feedback from the membership, our contract proposal has been revised accordingly and we are ready to negotiate. Throughout this entire process the objective has been to achieve an agreement our members can ratify that recognizes the sacrifices made by the membership.

#### Main Issues discussed included:

- Securing the next meeting date with the mediator and management
- Sacrifices made by the membership
- Revenue gains made by the company
- Additional concessions sought by the company
- Needs of the membership

We stressed the importance of securing an agreement as soon as possible and are currently waiting for a date from the mediator for the next session.

Send an e-mail to <u>talent.services@aa.com</u> with your name and employee number. State that you are a laid-off employee and want to put in for a 12M transfer. List where the transfer is (Tulsa) and what the position is (such as A/C Cleaner); and if you want full-time or part-time; Title one only has full-time, but you still have to list it.

Example: My name is John Doe, employee number 54321 and I am currently a laid-off OSM with recall rights to Tulsa. I would like to put in for a 12M transfer to the full-time position of A/C Cleaner in Tulsa, OK. My contact number 123-456-7890.

They will send a response via e-mail that your request was received and you are placed on the transfer list. Make a hard copy for your records and send one to the Union Hall for your file as back-up.

TWU514.ORG, CNN.COM, FAA.GOV are internet use. These websites and many more are accessible on most all of the American Airlines' computers. In fact, using the computer and these websites along with many others may be very helpful and a part of your job. But, yes, there is a BUT, Everyone needs to remember that all American Airlines' computers or any computers connected to the American Airlines' intranet system is being monitored by American Airlines. If your employee number is

logged in a computer and that computer is used to access the internet you may be called in and counseled about internet usage. If you log on to Jetnet for your time and attendance, print it off and take the record to your supervisor don't forget to sign off. Also, pay attention when you log into to DWMS to start a job and someone asks a question you may get distracted and forget to sign off. The next person might be surfing the net on your sign in. Remember that AA can record every key stroke on any company connected computer.
